#### FROM THE PASTOR

"My heart's desire and prayer to God for them is that they may be saved." Romans 10:1

Mes chers amis,

If you follow the news from Lafayette, you have most likely noted during the last month and a half that we have once again been faced with publicity concerning a truly sad and shameful part of our the history of our Diocese regarding sexual abuse of minors by Priests. The elderly among us have heard and seen those reports before. The younger ones may be seeing it for the first time. Yes, we do suffer for the sins of our brothers.

That recent publicity reminded me also of Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI's words to the Bishops of England and Scotland when he visited there in September of 2010. He spoke clearly about the terrible crime and shameful abuse of children by Priests. In doing so, he reflected with the Bishops on human frailty and, in particular, the human frailty of Priests. The Pope recalled the words of Blessed John Henry Newman, who once wrote: "O that God would grant the clergy to feel their weakness as sinful men, and the people to sympathize with them and love them and pray for their increase in all good gifts of grace" (Sermon, 22 March 1829). Here we see the Holy Father's call to Priests expressed by Blessed John Henry Newman: that they would be truly aware of their human weakness and to turn to Christ with all that they are for His grace... and for the people of God whom the Priest serves to treat him with sympathy, loving him and praying that he may be filled with grace.

As Catholics, we know about human weakness in the life of Priests. And as Newman wrote, you, the people of Ville Platte, have sought to love your Priests with great patience. I am deeply aware of the support of your prayers, and remain truly grateful for them!

One of my favorite saints, Ste. Therese of Lisieux, learned at an early age in life that Priests were not perfect, and spent the rest of her life as a Carmelite nun in prayer and sacrifice for the holiness of Priests. This is what she wrote in her *Story of a Soul*: "Having never lived close to [Priests], I was not able to understand the principle aim of the Reform of Carmel. To pray for sinners attracted me, but to pray for the souls of Priests whom I believed to be as pure as crystal seemed puzzling to me...[while on a pilgrimage to Rome] I lived in the company of many saintly Priests for a month and I learned that, though their dignity raises them above the angels, they are nevertheless weak and fragile men."

I recall Pope Benedict's words to be reminded that it is the Devil's ploy and good pleasure to tempt you to think that Priests are somehow angelic and without human weakness. Do not give in to his temptation. As Blessed John Henry Newman stated, pray that we Priests, knowing our human weakness, may rely on the grace of God... and that you, the Faithful, would continue to love and support Priests with your prayers and understanding. May we together call out in today's Responsorial Psalm: "Remember your mercies, O Lord!"

#### **CHURCH ETIQUETTE:**

We may wonder why the Catholic Church is such a quiet place. Many of our fellow Christians allow for fellowship in the sanctuary before and after services; why do the Catholic's not do this? The simple answer is the Roman Catholic Church has historically been a place of silence and reflection. The Roman Rite of the Church is categorized by sobriety of movement and gestures and simplicity in her music. While the Catholic Church does promote fellowship and community, it seeks its promotion outside of the confines of the sacred space of the church. Another question that may arise is the ageold question, "Is it permissible to leave Holy Mass before the dismissal?" The simple answer is that the Mass concludes with the dismissal. Congregants are encouraged to remain through the duration of the Mass and to show respect to the Priest Celebrant by waiting until the procession has left the building before exiting their pews. In secular events, we tend to respect a given performer as they are on stage by keeping silent during their performance. Likewise, in secular events, we would be remiss to leave the event before it has concluded, and in leaving that event we would mostly likely take our time and use great caution and courtesy in so doing. Perhaps, we can use these same ideas and gestures during and when leaving the Banquet of the Lamb.
